Plan

Six Meeting and Sixers Council

- In our Sixes, we are going to discuss how best to explore the Cub Scout Promise and Law
- The Sixers Council will make a detailed plan and help organise an investiture.
- Think of special local places to make it, like a hilltop, an ancient site, or a park? Where possible, have the investiture ceremony outdoors, possibly with a campfire or candles?
- Do the Cubs want anyone to attend the ceremony? Parents and family, other Section Leaders or the Group Leader
- How will you celebrate afterwards?

Exploring the Promise & Law

To help everyone understand the Promise, each Six should explore some of the ideas in an active way, such as

- The Sixer or Seconders explain the Cub Scout Promise in their own words to their Six and give some examples of how they will live by it.
- Each member of a six draws a picture representing a part of the Scout Law, all of these are assembled as the Six's collage which should be displayed in your meeting place
- Cub Scouts on their Taisteal could write a sketch that shows Cub Scout Promise in action and the six can act it out
- Each Cub Scout keeps a diary for a week and then considers how well they lived the Scout Promise during that week.

Do

Travel to the place you have selected and hold your investiture. The Sixers and Seconders should have roles of responsibility.
